I am quite honored and excited to be in this position as the YWCA of Gettysburg & Adams County continues to grow. We've all been through a lot over these past two years. With great joy and spirit, we look back on the past and head for the future.

In 2021, after our Bouncing Back Birthday Bash, we welcomed members back with Recreation Passes specially priced at \$9.09. The fundraising event celebrated 40 years at 909 Fairfield Road.

We're proud to have begun offering the Pennsylvania Pre-K Counts program at both of our Child Enrichment Program centers.

We successfully restarted Girls On The Run, an eight-week program that culminated with a 5-K run in May—a day when the pre-pandemic spirit was much

in evidence. The program is off and running again in 2022.

Our YWCA Aquatics program remains as strong as ever, surviving the darkest days of COVID. We also completed a significant upgrade of our pool's filtration system and greatly improved the flooring in the Aquatics locker room.

Did we mention that the popular Nearly New Sale returned to full-on, in-person status? It's a spring and fall event again, just like it used to be. Proceeds from this sale go to fund our many advocacy programs. The spring sale was a resounding success!

In the waning days of 2021, we noticed that the fitness center had started filling back up, that exercise classes were much more lively, and members and instructors were filtering back in.

We've still got a ways to go. But we're anxious to connect beyond the limitations of Wi-Fi through fully in-person offerings.

Throughout its long history, the YWCA has had many triumphs and challenges; this period is no different. We have always employed great people, and we are confident that the new Executive Director will continue this legacy.




CRITICAL RACE THEORY: WHAT'S REAL. WHAT'S TRUE. WHAT MATTERS.


JULY 2020 THROUGH JUNE 2021


