At the YWCA, we're committed to empowering women of all backgrounds and providing vital programs and services to the community. We offer various membership options, including those covered by health insurance. These insurance-based memberships are a fantastic resource, making our services accessible to a wider range of the community. Notably, nearly half of our membership is



through insurance membership. For example, in February 2024 there were 4,084 members on the roster. Of that, 1,959 were insurance access memberships.

At the YWCA, offering memberships at reduced rates to those who qualify through insurance providers, financial assistance, and those working a specified number of hours at the YW is important. Equally important are scholarships for youth to participate in programs like Basketball Skill Development, Swimming lessons, STEM camps, and more. One other way the YW empowers women of all backgrounds is by offering childcare subsidies to YWCA staff who work the required number of hours. This makes a big difference in YWCA staff having access to quality, affordable, and reliable childcare. The memberships, scholarships, financial aid, and employment benefits ensure everyone has an opportunity to thrive, but they also contribute to the operational expenses of the YWCA.

EITC Tax Credit

The YWCA is registered with the Department of Community and Economic Development as a Pre-Kindergarten Scholarship provider. S-Corporations, LLC, Partnerships, C-Corporations, etc... can name the YWCA of Gettysburg and Adams County in their application for tax credits in the year in which the contribution was made. Businesses authorized to do business in Pennsylvania who are subject to one or more of the following taxes are eligible to apply for EITC: Personal Income Tax, Capital Stock/Foreign Franchise Tax, Corporate Net Income Tax, Bank Shares Tax, Title Insurance & Trust Company Shares Tax, Insurance Premium Tax, Mutual Thrift Tax, Malt Beverage Tax, Surplus Lines Tax.
